

On the second day we headed to "Amazone" for the 10<sup>th</sup> Young BPW Symposium. Anna Zimmermann (Young Representative BPW Club Frankfurt, Germany) started the day with a presentation on the topic of volunteering. We then all discussed our personal motivation to be part of the BPW network. This was a great start to the Symposium, and it was also very insightful to hear each personal motivation stories.
